



## INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT CHRISTMAS

- 1. The image of Santa Claus flying his sleigh began in 1819 and was created by Washington Irving, the same author who dreamt up the Headless Horseman.
- 2. The Montgomery Ward department store created Rudolph the Reindeer as a marketing gimmick to encourage children to buy their Christmas coloring books.
- 3. The original Rudolph did not have a red nose. In that day and age, red noses were seen as an indicator of chronic alcoholism and Montgomery Ward did not want him to look like a drunkard.
- 4. America's first batch of eggnog was made in the Jamestown settlement in 1607. Its name comes from the word "grog" meaning any drink made with rum. Non-alcholic eggnog is popular as well.
- 5. Between the 16th and 19th centuries global temperatures were significantly lower than normal in what was known as a "little ice age." Charles Dickens grew up during that period and experienced snow for his first eight Christmases. This "White Christmas" experience influenced his writing and began a tradition of expectation for the holidays.
- 6. Since 1918 the city of Boston has received a giant Christmas tree as a gift from the Canadian province of Nova Scotia. Boston lent considerable support to the city of Halifax during their 1917 explosion and subsequent fire disaster.
- 7. In 2010 during the Christmas season, the Colombian government decorated jungle trees with lights. The trees lit up when the guerillas (terrorists) walked by and banners appeared asking them to surrender their arms. The campaign convinced 331 guerrillas to re-enter society and also won an award for strategic marketing excellence.
- 8. Bicycle, the U.S. playing card company, manufactured cards to give all the POW's in Germany during World War II as Christmas presents. These cards, when soaked in water, revealed an escape route for POW's. The Nazi's never knew.
- 9. The Christmas wreath was originally hung as a symbol of Jesus. The holly represents his crown of thorns and the red berries the blood he shed.
- 10. In Poland spiders are considered to be symbols of prosperity and goodness at Christmas. In fact, spiders and spider webs are often used as Christmas tree decorations. According to legend, a spider wove baby Jesus a blanket to keep him warm.

- 11. Tinsel was invented in 1610 in Germany and was once made of real silver.
- 12. The tradition of hanging stockings comes from a Dutch legend. A poor man had three daughters for whom he could not afford to provide a dowry. St. Nicholas dropped a bag of gold coins down his chimney and gold coins fell out and into the stockings drying by the fireplace. The daughters now had dowries and could be married, avoiding a life on the streets.
- 13. Brenda Lee recorded "Rockin Around The Christmas Tree" when she was only 13 years old.
- 14. If you gave all the gifts listed on the Twelve Days of Christmas, it would equal 364 gifts.
- 15. NORAD's "Santa Tracker" was born from a misprint in the newspaper. A 1955 Sears ad was suppose to print the number of a store where children could call and tell Santa what they wanted for Christmas. The number printed was to the hotline of the Director of Operations for the U.S. Continental Air Defense. Colonel Shoup ordered his staff to give the children updates on the flight coordinates
- of Santa. The tradition continues until this day. NORAD (North American Aerospace Defense Command) continues to provide flight updates on local news, the internet, and even a special iPhone application every Christmas.
- 16. You would have to use your artificial tree for more than 20 years for it to be "greener" than buying a fresh-cut tree annually.
- 17. Nova Scotia in the world's leading exporter of Christmas trees.

Deushka Moroz (Grandfather Frost) in Russia.



## 'Some of Mrs. Claus' Favorite Recipes'

#### STUFFED MUSHROOMS

Large mushrooms, brushed clean 1 pound Italian roll sausage 1 medium onion, diced finely 3 ounces Parmesan cheese

1/4 cup Italian seasoned bread crumbs

1 teaspoon garlic, chopped

1 teaspoon chopped parsley

Cook sausage; drain and add onion. Let steam a few minutes. Add cheese, bread crumbs, onion, garlic and parsley. Mix and remove from heat. Stuff mushrooms and cook at 350 degrees for fifteen minutes. Add more cheese on top.

#### **MOM'S DEVILED EGGS**

8 hard boiled eggs 1 1/2 tablespoons sweet pickle relish 1 teaspoon mustard Pepper Salad Dressing

Peel and slice eggs in half, lengthwise. Remove yolks. In medium bowl, mash yolks and salt and pepper to taste. Add relish, mustard and enough salad dressing to mix to desired consistency. Put into egg halves. Garnish with paprika is desired.

#### **BACON CRACKERS**

Nabisco Waverly wafer crackers Thin sliced bacon Parmesan Cheese

Break block of crackers into separate crackers. Hold each cracker over a bowl and sprinkle with cheese. Place half a strip of bacon lengthwise along cracker, tucking ends under well. Place on rack of large broiler pan near center of oven. Bake at 200 degrees for two hours. Do not turn oven up and rush

these. Bacon gets very crisp and crackers dry out. Can be served hot or cold. Can be prepared ahead and stored in tins or frozen.

#### NINE LAYER SALAD

1/2 head lettuce, shredded

1 cup celery, chopped

1 cup onion, chopped

1 cup green pepper, chopped 1 tall can green beans, drained

1 cup salad dressing or mayo

2 teaspoons sugar

1/4 cup Parmesan cheese

8 strips bacon cooked, crumbled (can uses bacon bits)

In a large bowl, layer all ingredients as listed starting with lettuce. Stir right before serving.

#### **BLUEBERRY SALAD**

2 (3 ounce) packages grape or blackberry Jello

1 (16 ounce) can crushed pineapple, undrained 1 (16 ounce) can blueberry pie filling

2 cups boiling water

1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese

1 (8 ounce) carton sour cream

1/2 cup sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup chopped pecans

Mix Jello, undrained pineapple, pie filling and boiling water. Pour into 9 x 13-inch baking dish and congeal overnight. Using a mixer, combine cream cheese, sour cream, sugar and vanilla. Spread over Jello mixture and sprinkle pecans on top.

#### CHRISTMAS MORNING CHOCOLATE GRAVY

2 tablespoons butter or margarine

2 tablespoons cocoa

2 tablespoons flour

1/4 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon vanilla 2 cups milk

Melt butter or margarine in skillet. Mix together dry ingredients. Add vanilla and milk to dry mixture. Pour into skillet with melted butter and cook over mediumhigh heat: stirring constantly until thick. Remove from skillet. Serve with hot biscuits.

#### SWEET AND SOUR MEATBALLS

1 pound hot bulk pork sausage

1 pound milk bulk pork sausage

1 1/4 cups ketchup

1/4 cup water

1 tablespoon soy sauce

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1 (15 ounce) can chunk pineapple, drained


Combine sausages, mixing well. Shape into 1-inch balls. Cook in large skillet over medium heat until browned. Drain. Combine remaining ingredients, except pineapple. Mix well and pour over meatballs. Simmer ten minutes, stirring occasionally. Add pineapple and simmer additional ten minutes, stirring often.

#### **HOLLY CLUSTERS**

1/4 cup butter 35 marshmallows 1/2 teaspoon vanilla 4 1/2 cups cornflakes 2 teaspoons green food coloring Red Hots





#### RUDOLPH'S RED VELVET CAKE

1 cup Crisco

2 eggs

1 1/2 cups sugar

1 teaspoon cocoa

1/4 cup (2 ounces) red food coloring (2 bottles)

2 1/4 cups flour

1 teaspoon salt

1 cup buttermilk

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 teaspoon soda

1 teaspoon vinegar Cool Whip or whip cream

Cream together Crisco, eggs and sugar. Mix in cocoa and food coloring. Add flour, salt and buttermilk. Add vanilla, soda and vinegar. Mix thoroughly. Grease and flour cake pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes. If using loaf pans, it will take longer; just check doneness with toothpick. Top with Cool Whip.

#### **GRANDMA'S RAISIN PIE**

3/4 cup sugar

2 tablespoons flour

3 eggs

1/2 stick margarine

2 cups milk

1 teaspoon vanilla

1/2 cup raisins, softened in water Baked pie shell

Mix sugar, flour, eggs, margarine and milk. Cook filling until thick. Add raisins and vanilla. Pour into baked pie shell. Let sit 30 minutes before serving.

#### COCONUT-BLACK WALNUT POUND CAKE

- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup oil
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 4 eggs, beaten
- 1 cup buttermilk 1 cup flaked coconut
- 3 cups all purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 cup black walnuts, chopped
- 2 teaspoons coconut flavoring Combine sugar, oil and eggs. Beat well.

Combine dry ingredients; add to sugar mixture alternately with buttermilk, beating well after each addition. Stir in nuts, coconut and flavoring. Pour into well greased and floured 10-inch tube pan. Bake at 325 degrees for one hour and five minutes or until done. Pour hot coconut syrup over cake while cake is hot. Allow cake to remain in pan for four hours to absorb syrup. Wrap well. Cake will be very moist.

Coconut Syrup 1 cup sugar 1/2 cup water

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 teaspoon coconut flavoring

In saucepan, combine sugar, water and butter. Bring to a boil. Boil for five minutes. Remove from heat. Stir in coconut flavoring. Pour over cake.

#### FRUIT CAKE SQUARES

6 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted

- 4 cups vanilla wafer crumbs
- 3/4 cup halved candied green cherries 1/2 cup chopped candied pineapple
- 3/4 cup chopped dates
- 1 cup pecan halves
- 1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Pour melted butter in 15 x 10 x 1-inch baking pan. Sprinkle evenly with wafer crumbs. Arrange cherries, pineapple, dates and pecans evenly over crumbs; press down gently. Combine milk and vanilla; pour over fruit. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-25 minutes. Cut into small squares.

#### **OLD-FASHIONED PRUNE CAKE**

- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 1 cup Wesson Oil
- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon soda 1/2 teaspoon allspice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 eggs, unbeaten
- 1 cup chopped nuts 1 cup prunes, cooked
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix sugar, buttermilk, and oil in bowl. Sift flour and add cinnamon, nutmeg, soda, allspice and salt. Add this mixture to buttermilk mixture. After combining mixtures, add eggs, nuts, prunes and vanilla. Bake at 350 degrees for forty minutes.

Icing for Prune Cake

- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 1/2 cup buttermilk 1 teaspoon butter
- a spoonful into a glass of cold water). Pour over warm cake.

#### SALTINE CRACKER CANDY

- 1 sleeve saltine crackers, unbroken
- 1 cup light brown sugar
- 1 cup butter...do not use margarine
- 1 (12 ounce) package chocolate chips

Line cookie sheets with foil, then layer with crackers. Melt butter with sugar. Stir the boiling mixture for three minutes. Pour over the crackers. Bake at 400 degrees for five minutes. Remove and sprinkle with chocolate chips. Place back in oven for approximately one minute for the chips to soften.

#### NO COOK DIVINITY

1 (7.2 ounce) package fluffy white frosting mix 1/3 cup light corn syrup 1 teaspoon vanilla

1/2 cup boiling water

1 pound confectioners sugar

1 cup nuts

Combine frosting mix, corn syrup, vanilla and boiling water in small mixing bowl. Beat on highest speed until stiff peaks form, about five minutes. Transfer to larger bowl and, on lower speed or by hand, gradually blend in confectioners sugar. Stir in nuts. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto wax paper.

#### **HOLLY CLUSTERS**

1/4 cup butter 35 marshmallows

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

4 1/2 cups cornflakes

2 teaspoons green food coloring Red Hots

Melt butter and marshmallows over medium heat. Add vanilla and food coloring. Pour over cornflakes and stir until well colored. Dip by spoonfuls onto waxed paper. Top with 2 or 3 Red Hots. Let cool and dry completely, then store in covered container.





- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg

1 teaspoon vanilla

Put raisins in water and boil until liquid is absorbed. Beat eggs and add applesauce, sweetener, oil and raisins. Mix flour and soda; stir in cinnamon, nutmeg and vanilla. Add to first mixture. Pour into sprayed 8-inch square pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 40 minutes or 350 degrees for 25 minutes or until done. Garnish with whipped topping, if desired. \*Equal cannot be used as a sugar substitute for this recipe.









So saying, He broke a branch from the


fir tree that grew near the door, and He planted it in the ground and disappeared. But the branch grew into a great tree, and every year it bore wonderful golden fruit for the kind children.
