Bush answers call to duty at Cannon County

Brent Bush had completed his call to duty when he retired from the military last summer.

After 20-plus years serving in the Army, where he achieved the rank of lieutenant colonel, Bush was set for retirement and an enjoyable rest of his life.

He returned to his hometown of Woodbury and took a position as a teacher and assistant football coach.

Bush did not realize it at the time but another call to duty was waiting.

It came in March when he was named Cannon County's new football coach, replacing Joel Schrenk who had resigned in January to accept a similar position in Alabama.

The move was unexpected but it was one Bush believed he was not only ready for, but also needed to pursue.

"I was shocked to have the opportunity," said Bush, who is serving as a head football coach for the first time. "It's not about me. It's about the organization. I am honored to lead these young men and this program. When they gave me the opportunity I felt like I could saddle up and do the best I can.

"I bring an experience. I don't know if it's the right experience, but it's my experience."

Bush will lead the Lions into the 2012 season opener when they play host to Watertown Friday. Kickoff is 7 p.m. Fittingly, it is also "Salute to Veterans" at Schwartz Stadium. Bush has a vested interest in the program, having played at Cannon County High School and later for Head Coach Boots Donnelly at MTSU.

These are his roots and working with Cannon County's youth is his mission and passion.

"If I am just the football coach then I have failed," Bush said. "You have to try to get them to be good people and get them to understand about honor, dignity, trust and truth and being a person of your word. You have to mean what you say."

Make no mistake, Bush will school players in fundamentals and conditioning. That much already is evident.

He also expects them to be good citizens. What he wants more than anything is for Cannon County football players to be the best they can be.

"You have to dare to be great," Bush said. "I tell our players not to limit themselves. You have to motivate yourself and decide internally how good you want to be. You have to put in the work to get there. "

Bush likes the direction of the program through summer conditioning and the preseason; however, the first-year coach says the Lions are a work in progress.

"We may fall short in some things but we are constantly trying to get better and these kids play hard," Bush said. "These kids have an opportunity to contribute and I want them to take advantage of that."

Even though the Lions are coming off a (See Bush, page 5)

tough 0-10 campaign and are 1-19 over the last two years, Bush believes there is a silver lining.

"We have momentum right now," Bush said. "I have a great staff and the kids have an opportunity to be a really good team. If we can get there it is possible to accomplish great things. It's tough, but it's possible. You don't do it for me, you do it for the guys on the field with you and that's what I'm trying to teach. We have had some hard times, sure, but hard times reveal your character.

"We have to play every play like it's our last until the whistle blows. If we can do that then we have to chance to beat any team in our district."

Bush says he is realistic and realized District 8-AA is always tough; however, the Lions' field general also refuses to sell his players short. The Lions have performed well during the preseason and have made strides offensively and defensively. Putting it all together is the challenge ahead.

"We have good young men who work hard and want to be good," Bush said. "These guys get to be part of something bigger than themselves and that's what they have to understand. Kids don't fight for their country or play football for their school. They play for one another. Down range they are fighting every day for one another to get their buddies home alive. It transcends all sports. That's what it means when we talk about no 'l' in team."

Bush said team and individual goals are set by the players and he encourages setting the standard high on a daily basis.

Without standards and goals he says players have little to work toward.

"I want our players to set their goals high and work to reach them," Bush said. "If you have to adjust that's fine but you need to have high expectations of yourself and then give it your best to achieve them."

New-look offense could provide spark

Cannon Co. could utilize two-QB system

Cannon County managed to score just 15 touchdowns during its 2011 season.

First-year Head Coach Brent Bush is hoping a revamped offense with a different approach will help jumpstart the unit during the 2011 campaign. The Lions will have a new quarterback after rising junior Ryan Jordan transferred to Eagleville during the summer. Jordan threw for 1,744 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2011. Also gone is rising junior tight end Waylon Sedtal who caught 28 passes for 242 yards and a touchdown. Despite the offensive

departures Bush likes what he sees from the Lions during the preseason. Senior Cody Petro was one of the team's chief receivers in 2011 but he will go under center to start the 2012 campaign. Sophomore Jake Todd also has put up strong numbers in the preseason and will be in the offensive mix throughout the season. "Both quarterbacks bring different dimensons to our offense and both of them are good players," Bush said. "Petro brings leadership and quickness to the position. Jake is a solid quarterback and good athlete. He's just young, but we will count on him throughout the season. I feel good about both of those guys." Senior Justin Tobin led the team in (See Offense, page 7) receptions (54) and yards (750) and also accounted for four touchdowns. He is one of the top all-around talents in District 8-AA and will be heavily counted upon.

B.J. Daniel primarily found himself blocking as an offensive lineman as a sophomore; however, the rising junior will be in the offensive backfield this season. Daniel will split time at fullback and tailback. Joining him is junior Hawk Love and sophomore A.J. Daniel, who did not play last season but has made a splash during the 2012 preseason. He has also seen action at receiver.

"We have some weapons in the offensive backfield and we have guys that do a lot of different things but they are equally important," Bush said. "We will utilize all the skills of each of those players to the fullest."

Petro said the overall weapons the team possesses will make a

difference when the Lions hit the field for their opener against Watertown, Aug. 17, at home.

"We have a lot of talented players," Petro said. "I believe we have more confidence and we have executed well overall. Of course, there is room for improvement but the direction we are going is good and I believe we have shown promise on offense."

How good the Lions are able to funtion offensively will depend on the offensive linemen. Dalton Ryan, Case Isenhart, Allan Robinson, Dillion Jackson and Sean Stone are the front runners for starting positions.

In previous seasons the Lions have been a predominant passing team; however, the offensive line will be even more important with a greater emphasis on the running game during the 2012 season.

"We are going to throw the football because we have the

weapons to do that," Bush said. "I

like our quarterbacks. Our receivers have worked hard and continue to improve and our running backs are showing steady improvement and running with a purpose. In order for it all to work those guys up front have to perform well and they have. We need to do better as far as getting a push and being better in run blocking. The pass protection has been good but we need to improve the run blocking."

Senior James Purvis is a reliable pass catcher and senior Jarrett Melton has joined the squad and will add to the depth at receiver. The Lions also plan to employ the services of several young players, such as freshman receiver Colin Anderson and freshman tight end Bo Bryson.

The Lions debut their new look Friday against Watertown.

Hard hitting defense on agenda for Cannon Co.

Cannon County's football team is looking for an identity when it takes the field for the 2012 season.

The Lions appear to have found it on the defensive side of the football, where they are displaying a hard-hitting, enthusiastic approach and playing with a passion to turn around past misfortune.

"We have played well in our scrimmages and we have had a good offseason," senior Ryan McLaurine said. "We want to play with an attitude on the defensive side of the ball. We have the talent to be a good defense. We have to stay healthy and be fundamentally sound."

Cannon County's experience and depth is greatest on the defensive side of the football. The Lions should enjoy much improvement in the area of stopping the run as the defensive front is a strong suit.

Defensive linemen Terry Parker, Dalton Ryan and Dillion Jackson are staunch run stoppers. They have been outstanding in two preseason scrimmages and have yet to allow a rushing touchdown or more than 50 yards on the ground.

"I believe we have shown some improvement and made some gains there," Head Coach Brent Bush said. "Everyone has to carry out their assignments and do their job but our guys up front are getting penetration and they are stopping the run with consistency. That has to continue in order for us to be the team we want to be this season."

Jonathan Smith, B.J. Daniel, McLaurine and Jackson Mason form a tough combination in the middle at linebacker and end positions, along with Hawk Love, Case Isenhart and Brandon James.

"We are playing with more passion and enthusiasm on defense," Daniel said. "People are flying around and we have done a good job of stopping the run, not giving up the big plays and not allowing sustained drives. We have

also managed to get pressure on the quarterback and make some tackles for lost yardage so that has helped too. We have a chance to be a very good defense if we keep improving and keep everyone healthy."

Cannon County's defensive backfield will see several players rotate in a platoon system. Cody Petro, Jake Todd, Wilder Mankin, A.J. Daniel, Justin Tobin and Ethan Smith all have seen action there, and senior Jarrett Melton recently joined the team and has adapted to the position as evidenced by earning a start in his first scrimmage.

"We have several players who can help us in the defensive backfield," Bush said. "We have rotated them and tried to get several players work because they can do a good job for our team."

Much of the defensive backfield; however, is young and inexperienced with the exception of Tobin and Petro so the young pups will be thrown to the wolves early. "That's why it's important to get a good pass rush and continue getting that good pressure up front," Bush said. "We have to take some of the pressure off of our secondary by getting a good push up front and making the opposing quarterback feel a little uneasy back there."

McLaurine said he believes Cannon County's defense could be the deciding factor as to whether the Lions have a breakthrough season in 2012.

"We have the talent to keep our team in games and even to win games on defense," McLaurine said. "We have to take on the mindset and believe in it. We have to have a mindset that even if we give up yards we are not going to give up touchdowns. When teams do score on us we have to make them earn it and not just score with ease."

Cannon County's defensive players are saying all the right things. More importantly, they are playing the right way.
