

Recipe of the Month

HONEY BUN CAKE

1 box yellow cake mix

1/3 cup water

4 eggs

2/3 cup oil

1 cup sour cream

Mix all ingredients well and pour 1/2 batter in greased and floured 9x13 pan.

Mix 1 cup brown sugar & 3 tablespoons cinnamon and spread on batter in pan. Add remaining batter and cut thru with a knife. Bake at 355 degrees for 40 minutes. While cake is hot punch holes in top and pour the following mixture over cake.—3 cups powdered sugar, 1/2 cup milk and 2 tsp. vanilla that has been mixed well.

1 cup milk

1/4 cup vinegar


1 tsp. salt, pepper, garlic powder, & onion powder to taste

ADOPT-A-SENIOR STAR




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Adopt-A-Senior Star program begins on November 21st.
