Invitation to Bid

Description of items/services requested:

The Cannon County Election Commission is accepting bids from qualified vendors for the replacement of its current voting system. This will include the purchase of ballot marking devices, ballot tabulators, tabulation system, high speed central vote tabulator, (possibly) electronic pollbooks, training, technical support, and Election Day support.

The Cannon County Election Commission serves 9500 registered voters. We have nine Election Day precincts, one early voting location, and currently twenty-six machines.

The voting system proposed to the Cannon County Election Commission must meet the following minimum requirements: certified by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission to the 2005 Voluntary Voting Systems Guidelines, certified by the TN State Election Commission and Coordinator of Elections, and should have accessibility features to allow voters with disabilities to vote privately.

General Requirements:

Proposals, bids, or responses will be accepted by the Cannon County Department of Finance no later than **10:00 a.m. October 11, 2022** (local time). Every document must be enclosed in an envelope clearly marked as a bid document. Any response, bid or proposal received after the above deadline shall be considered late, and will not be opened or considered. Bid prices must be valid for at least thirty (30) days.

Public Hearing for THDA HOME Grant

Cannon County have been awarded a Tennessee Housing Development Agency HOME Rehabilitation grant for the purpose of improve the safety and structural correctness of homes. Applications will be taken for those interested in improving their homes at the Cannon County Courthouse on Thursday, October 13, 2022 at 5:00 p.m..

To be eligible you must have owned your home for a period of one year and presently live in the home. You must be low-income (information on income guidelines will be available). In addition, your home must need repairs to bring it up to local standards. This is not a remodeling program and only those in need will be considered for this grant.

As with all federal funding, you must provide certain information in order to apply. In order to assist in having your application taken quickly, you will need the following information to submit your application:

- Full names, amount of income, and social security numbers for everyone living in your home.
- Verification of income, which can be either a copy of a government check (Social Security, SSI, VA, AFDC, etc.), a copy of a bank statement which shows the amount of direct deposits of government checks, and award letter for a government check, a copy of a paycheck stub showing your year-to-date earnings, and official statement from your employer which shows your income tax statement for self-employed individuals.
- A copy of the deed to your property.
- A copy of your property tax statement with receipt showing 2021 taxes paid and proof of no outstanding taxes.
- A copy of your homeowner's insurance which provide the amount of your coverage.

For the application, you will need to state your regular monthly payments, the name, address and phone number to your mortgage institution and the repairs needed to be made to your home.

Bring the information listed above to the meeting with you, and staff will assist you in completing the application.
