#### CINNAMON BUTTER BAKED CARROTS UPSIDE-DOWN PECAN CAKE

15 whole carrots, peeled and stems

removed 1/3 cup butter, softened 1/2 cup sugar 1 teaspoon kosher salt 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1/3 cup boiling water 1 tablespoon orange juice Fresh parsley, chopped (optional)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Clean carrots and arrange in 9 x 13 baking dish. Using an electric mixer, cream the butter, sugar, salt and cinnamon. While the mixer is running, slowly add the boiling water and orange juice. Pour mixture over the carrots and cover the dish with aluminum foil. Bake for 90 minutes. Remove the foil and transfer carrots to a serving platter. Drizzle carrots with the melted cinnamon butter from the baking dish. Garnish with chopped parsley if desired.

#### **ROASTED SWEET POTATOES**

- 3 sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into bite size cubes
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 tablespoon of brown sugar (more if you like it sweeter)
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

- For the topping: 2 cups toasted pecans, chopped 1 cup shredded coconut
- 2/3 cup brown sugar
- 6 tablespoons butter, melted
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

For the cake: 2 cups all-purpose flour 1 cup brown sugar, packed 1 cup milk 2/3 cup butter, softened 2 large eggs 1 tablespoon baking powder 2 teaspoons vanilla

1/4 teaspoon salt

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and line a 9 x 13 inch pan with aluminum foil, making sure it hangs over the sides a bit, then grease with non-stick spray. Spread pecans, brown sugar and 1 cup of the coconut in the pan. Sprinkle with cinnamon and salt, and drizzle with vanilla extract and melted butter. In a medium bowl, beat together the 2/3 cup butter and 1 cup brown sugar on medium speed with an electric mixer until creamy. Continue mixing on low, and add eggs one at a time, followed by vanilla, mixing until thoroughly combined. Add baking powder and salt, mixing on low until incorporated. Add 1/2 of the flour, followed by milk, and then remaining flour, mixing well after each addition. Pour batter over pecan mixture in prepared pan and bake until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 35-40 minutes. Run a knife around the sides of the pan to loosen and et cake cool in pan for 5 minutes. Invert cake onto a platter, using foil overhang as needed. Let cool 15 minutes before serving.
